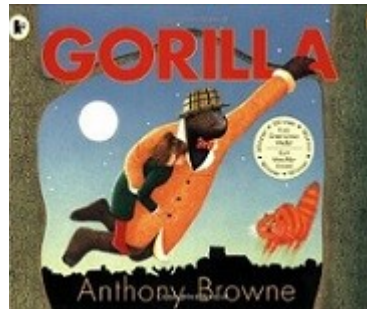


In order to support the children to meet their end of year targets we would like the children to practise their maths skills at home. Please could they practise:

- Having a Great Fire of London workshop with a theatre company.

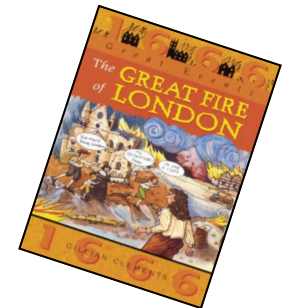
If possible please can you send in a cereal box and other boxes (tea/biscuit etc) for your child to make a 'Tudor House' as soon as possible. Thank you.
